Minimalist ArtBCs

Tom R. Chambers uses his Minimalist art works as a vehicle for learning ABCs - letter detection/recognition. He feels that as young children learn their letters, they can also be sensitized to art - color and form. Not only will they begin to identify the letters of the alphabet, but also appreciate the aesthetics of color and form that comprise the Arts.

Many of the letters - upper and lower case - are of the same color as their background to indicate color-scheme relationships. They also contrast and color-coordinate with their immediate placement within the art work. The expanse of the art work engulfs and isolates the letters for immediate detection and at the same time, creates an overview of color and form.

Color and form (shapes) are a wonderment for children. They are aroused by this "strange" and surprising combination. This combination moves them toward play and discovery as a learning process. And detecting letters this way should result in recognition of ABCs within the context of a "sense of awe".

Minimalism

It is an extreme form of abstract art and typified by artworks composed of simple geometric shapes based on the square and the rectangle. It offers a highly purified form of beauty.
